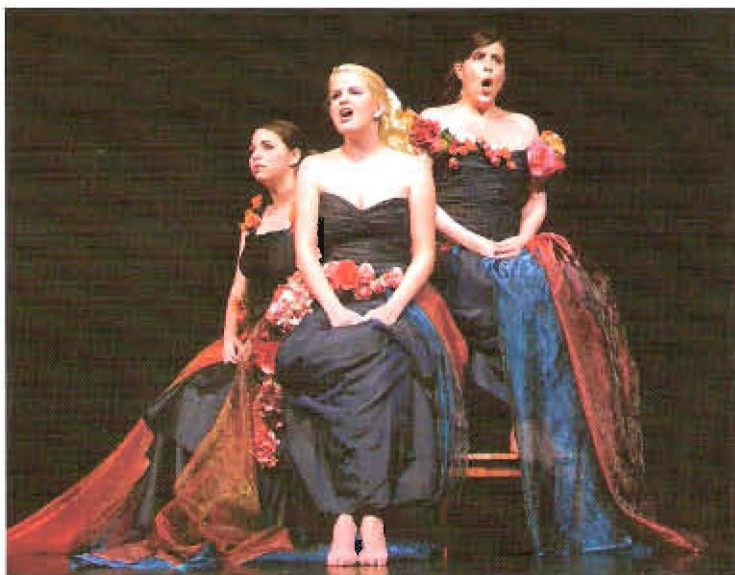
MOVIE IN THE PARK Sept.
